Dear Friends in Christ,

When an argument occurred, the grandmother went over to the large, family Bible, read a verse or two, and was immediately calmed. This vision from *The Waltons* TV

show, set in the 1930's may hold an idealistic viewpoint of Scripture's power, however, it was not lost on me that Scripture was the foundation of her life. What role does Holy Scripture play in your life? Would it be something you reference prior to a decision or when seeking comfort?

In last week's email, I wrote about our formation series this Fall and would like to explore this concept more. Within our denomination, we read a significant amount of Scripture in our liturgical worship. The lectionary is a chart of Scripture we read in worship over the course of a three-year cycle. We actually have three lectionaries in our denomination. We have the Sunday lectionary, the Daily Office Lectionary (two-year Cycle), the daily Eucharistic readings (for Eucharist on non-Sundays), and the Lesser Feasts and Fasts Lectionary with readings for each saint. Our Book of Common Prayer and companion Hymnals are full of Scripture. I write this to emphasize the importance of our Scriptures within our particular tradition.

Our Bible is not the revelation of God, but tells the story of salvation history and of the Messiah. This means that we acknowledge that our Scripture contains all things necessary for salvation and that it tells us about the Revelation of God, especially in the person of Jesus Christ. With the words being divinely inspired, we also recognize that the Spirit still moves in and through the Scripture as we read or hear it. Have you ever heard a new insight when reading a familiar passage? This also means that Scripture is not only accessible to non-clergy but that God's Spirit may speak to and through each one of us.

We will unlock Scripture this Fall to help those who may be experts better understand the Bible and help those who struggle to open the Bible gain confidence. While we are

firming up a few more dates, you may find some of the below scheduled topics of interest to you:

- September 22nd (Dr. Stephen Cook) I like the Old Testament God better than the New Testament God
- October 6th (The Rev. Dr. Katherine Grieb) An Anglican/Episcopal Reading of Scripture
- October 13th (Rabbi Billinson, Adat Reyim) A conversation with Fr. Will on the Hebrew Scriptures
- November 17th (The Rev. William L. Packard) How to Study the Bible
- TBD Praying with Scripture and other topics

By the end of this Fall, the hope is a greater comfort and/or new insights into our Bible. How might you reference Scripture and your faith in those decisions such as the instance which plagued grandma in the Waltons? Perhaps you will hear the words of Scripture differently on Sunday morning. As our children study the lectionary readings, how might we all talk about Scripture together?

I look forward to our continued partnership in the Gospel!

The goal of this formation series is to reinforce the reformational ideals of accessible worship and Scripture. The Bible has never been more accessible with apps, books, numerous translations and paraphrases, online courses, YouTube, and more. As Episcopalians, we worship with and through Scripture. While we hold some Bible studies, many individuals find Scripture intimidating or themselves inadequately equipped to read much less interpret. When we engage with other faith traditions, we may find it difficult to express our own view of Scripture and have less of an understanding of sacred Scriptures in other traditions.

A summer with few food drives and low food donations has left ECHO's Food Pantry with urgent needs. Requests for food assistance are higher than ever before. Before COVID, ECHO purchased about 5 to 8% of food staples. ECHO currently purchases around 40% of the food they distribute because food donations only cover 60% of the need.
