Dear Friends in Christ,

With our Fall and October traditions, we tend to find ourselves with a surplus of candy in our lives. This is especially true

on the last day of October. One of my favorite practices after this event is the Candy Tithe, when we ask the children (and adults) to give one-tenth of their candy to the church. We inevitably have an overflowing wagon each year! We donate this candy and hope to give it to college-aged kids this year.

Along with this tradition being a fun practice, we are also asked to explain to our kids why we give a tenth of the candy to church. This isn't just the unwanted candy, but the good stuff too! It is a way of orienting our lives towards God as disciples of Jesus Christ. Our children and indeed our own hearts are bound to ask the question, "but why?"

We respond to this question, part of our "inquiring and discerning hearts," with Scripture, Reason, and Tradition. The act of stewardship is founded in Scripture such as Leviticus 27:30 which states that "a tithe of everything from the land, whether grain from the soil or fruit from the trees, belongs to the Lord; it is holy to the Lord." The word מְשֵׁשֶׁס maaser means "tenth" or "tithe." Our New Testament sources reference the tithe and ask that it also corresponds with how we live. We are also reminded in 2 Corinthians that "God loves a cheerful giver." In addition, our National Canons ask that (Canon 9.6.b.2.iii) we all be instructed in "the biblical standard of the tithe for financial stewardship." Our reasoning applies the amount that enables us to recognize that everything comes from God and that we put our whole trust and faith in God and Jesus Christ. This is a true act of faith, especially when considering a Reese's Peanut **Butter Cup!** 

We cast our nets as disciples and "put your whole trust in his grace and love." We recall Andrew and the disciples' faith and their orientation to follow Christ. At St. Andrew's, we have certainly cast our nets! I want to say thank you for the many gifts of our community of time, talent, and treasure! Each and every day at church and especially Sunday the gifts of faith through Stewardship abound! With this growing ministry, we look to provide further support and it is through your generosity that we will be able to hire an Assistant Priest and an Interim Director of Music.

I reflect on my time at St. Andrew's and am encouraged in my own faith by the "cheerful giving!" The gifts of stewardship from the Stewardship team have been amazing. This year on October 20th, we will have an ingathering when we encourage you to bring your 2025 financial pledge to liturgy as an offering before God. Our online pledge form may be easier and know that in that moment we are acknowledging your gift as an offering before God.

I am grateful to serve and worship with you as we offer our gifts to God as disciples of Jesus together. Our wagon is overflowing with candy and with the grace of God. I look forward to seeing you this month when we particularly acknowledge the many gifts of God and present ourselves as a "living sacrifice" to God.

#### **ENDOWMENT NEWS**

In memory of our son, Bill Gould, who passed July 5th, 2023, Sharon and I created an endowment to reflect the special person Bill grew to be, learning from his experiences at St. Andrew's and going on to create his special community for family, neighbors, co-workers, and friends.

As former President Bill Clinton said, "Those of us who have more yesterdays than tomorrows tend to care more about our children and grandchildren. ... in the greatest country on earth, we have always been about tomorrow. Your children and grandchildren will bless you forever if you do."

Establishing an endowment at St. Andrew's is one way to assure our children and generations in the future who come to St. Andrew's will have a community where values and ideas are modeled, understood, and become deeply-held beliefs that guide their actions to make this a better world for all. The St. Andrew's community helped shape Bill's values, and we believe this endowment will preserve and maintain that for others.

St. Andrew's community shaped our family in several ways:

- Opportunity to acquire values, interacting with people with principles;
- Places where our values are developed;
- Activities, where we can explore our potential;
- Music and the arts—lifting our voices with our choir in praise and joy, or as Bill learned, simply singing with your children in the minivan going down the road; and
- Worship —where we learn to love our neighbors as ourselves and to perfect values to guide our lives, reflecting the teachings of Christ.

The French phrase, "je ne sais quoi," speaks to personal qualities that can not be easily described or named. Bill developed in part from the community at St. Andrew's and our home, where he grew to love people, trees, and plants.

His favorite tree was a Paper Bark Maple, and we planted one at the Church in his memory. We can all watch it glow red in the fall and develop delicate paper bark, reminding us that community begins with a place. A few weeks ago, Father Will blessed it with our family there, to the glory of God in the memory of Bill Gould.

We created the Bill Gould endowment to support a vision of St. Andrew's gardens and campus, the outdoor space, and our first parish impression as our island home, welcoming families to a place of peace and beauty. The earnings from the endowment—supported by generous contributions from other parishioners—provide income and funds to plant, prune, and sustain our parish beds and grounds. This endowment helps to achieve that vision.

You, as well, may have a vision for St. Andrew's and the opportunity to establish the means to an end that speaks to your heart. Think of a gift that helps you and others model the values you believe Christ has called you to embrace in your life. When you imagine one, I encourage you to start or contribute to an endowment to make your vision a reality, improving St. Andrew's and enhancing values that will make our world a better place.
