Dear Friends in Christ,

In this season of many new beginnings, we take time to reflect upon God's abounding grace. The season of Advent is

our new Church year when we begin again. This season's title comes from the Latin, Adventus, meaning "arrival" or "coming." We anticipate the coming of Jesus at Christmas and the promise that Christ will come again. In this anticipation, we intentionally prepare for these comings in the knowledge that we may always begin again.

We celebrate many exciting beginnings this month, especially as we welcome two new clergy to our parish! The Rev. Maria Maguire's first Sunday will be on December 8th and the Rev. Susie Harding, Deacon, will begin on December 1st! At our 10:00 a.m. service on December 8th, we will celebrate the new ministry with our new clergy and Assisting Bishop Bud Shand. In addition, we will welcome those affirming the faith promised at their Baptisms and we will all reaffirm our Baptismal Promises. These are opportunities for us to recall the promises we made and to remember the promise fulfilled in the new covenant by God in Christ and the Holy Spirit.

While the Advent season is often characterized in a similar way to Lent, we will celebrate, especially December 8th as we observe the Advent season. To engage in Advent is to prepare ourselves for the coming of Christ and remember the Incarnation. When you reflect upon our Advent offerings, how might you be able to observe the spirit of the Advent season? December is often overshadowed by a secular Christmas season which, while wonderful, can diminish the gift of Advent and new beginnings. I am not saying to deny the joys of this season. In this time, how might you observe these new beginnings of Advent and recall the promises at Baptism?

One way to encounter Advent is to remember the promises we make in our Baptism which are beautiful and quite difficult. We may sometimes forget that a covenant involves two entities with our God promising grace, blessing, and the fulfillment of the Old Covenant in Christ which continues until his coming again. This is the grace present when this season does not feel as joyful as we feel it should. This grace enables us to return to Christ and God from wherever our earthly pilgrimages have taken us. This grace upholds us in all we encounter and its abundance cannot be counted!

As we begin again, I am grateful to God that we may all live in this Covenant together.

May you have a blessed Advent!

I love listening to the sounds of children playing on the playground. It helps me remember just how powerful learning

through play is for a young child. As the children play, I hear them telling stories, pretending, walking up the slide, pulling friends in wagons, and decorating a Christmas tree in the gazebo. The natural world is a wonderful resource for helping children meet their early learning goals.

I continue to be amazed at a classroom of children growing into a community of learners. At the beginning of the year our students are unfamiliar with each other, not sure of routines, and wondering why they need to leave their house to come to us. Familiarity and trust lay the groundwork for a powerful learning community. Plentiful unstructured and structured playtimes create a place where children take chances, make mistakes, discover new things, build relationships, and ask thoughtful questions. This transformation is beginning to happen in our classrooms. It is a beautiful reminder of the importance of an engaging classroom. We look forward to Christmas Programs the week of December 16th followed by a cookie reception and Santa visit! Look for a beautiful Nativity scene designed by our students in the Parish Hall.
